A key that says "Do Not Duplicate" is usually stamped with a small number on the top of the key. The number indicates the manufacturer of the key or an identification number. If you plan to duplicate a key, ensure that the original is in good condition.

Coat Hanger

It may require some patience and trial and error to get the hanger in the correct position, but once you do then it's simple to move the hook to grasp the lock mechanism and pull.

It's a very common trick that many people attempt to accomplish on their own, however it could be a risk. If you don't do it correctly you could damage the paint on your car or crack the window seal. Both of these would require replacement. A professional locksmith will be able solve this issue more quickly and effectively.

This method isn't always effective for all vehicles. It usually does not work with the latest locking mechanisms, and often doesn't work with any door that has a button that opens it from the inside. A professional locksmith can handle this situation without damaging the door. They might also be able do it faster than you.

When using a coat hanger, you may not be able to fit the hook's end in the small space between the door and the frame. If this is the situation you'll have to move the coat hanger as far as possible between the frame of the door and the window. You may be able to use a slim Jim as an alternative to a hanger, but make sure to consult the owner's manual to confirm.

Slim Jim



Many people have seen locksmiths unlock cars with tools that look like beef-jerky sticks. They are known as Slim Jims and they have a single purpose for locksmiths: to gain access to locked vehicles without the need for a key. They are a popular tool among professional locksmiths. These metal strips are long and thin and have a hook on one end. They can be easily placed under the car window and then maneuvered to catch, tug, or manipulate the lock mechanism inside.

Although it is a specialist tool that should only be used by trained locksmiths, it is still able to cause serious damage to your vehicle if you attempt to make use of it by yourself. It is possible to end up permanently damaging the lock using this tool. G28 Car Keys will need to be replaced. You could also end up paying more over the long term to repair your car in the event that you damage it.

There are a range of Slim Jims in most auto parts stores. You can choose from a range of sizes and shapes, so make sure you choose one that matches the door locks you have. The majority of these tools are made from steel or brass which makes them strong. They also have a notched tip that can be put into the keyhole to attach to the rods and levers that trigger the lock. The locksmith can then pull the Slim Jim to release the mechanism and open the car.

Begin by determining the model and year of your car. Then, determine whether it has vertical or upright ones. You will probably have a more recent model that has locks that are powered. To unlock, you must press the button. These locks are hard to open using a Slim Jim.

Once you have determined if your vehicle has vertical or upright locks, insert the Slim Jim in between the window and rubber strip that runs across the edge. Then slowly and gently slide the tool into the wedge, pressing it into the slot. If you notice that the lock is moving, then you have successfully latched on to the locking mechanism. At this moment, the locksmith will gently pull the Slim Jim to activate the car door lock.
